TIME REQUIREMENT: 15 minutes

RULES:

1. This is a chapter event which is registered during Career Development Event registration
2. Timeline for activities is March 1 – March 1
3. Provide evidence of competition of events and activities
4. Official FCCLA Notebook or Power Point template

CHAPTER OPERATIONS (must complete all activities) – **4 points**

1. Hold chapter meetings – minutes and agendas
2. Local leadership training for officers
3. Develop a yearlong Program of Work
4. Utilize local Alumni and Associates members at events

PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS (must complete all activities) – **6 points**
